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| proj_desc | Spanish-English cognates are Spanish and English words that are orthographically, semantically, and syntactically similar. There are more than 20,000 such words in the English language. Some, such as the English word "rent" and the Spanish word "renta" are fairly transparent. Others such as the English word "cat" and the Spanish word "gato" are not so obvious. I plan to conduct a series of learning and forgetting experiments using my compilation of over 20,000 cognate words as stimuli. The purpose of these studies will be to find those cognates educators can use to facilitate second language learning for Spanish-speaking adults and schoolchildren. |
